In 2011 together with UNESCO, the Permanent Memorial Committee launched an international design competition. (7)

"It was very important to set a symbolic gesture, a sign here at United Nations Headquarters to commemorate the victims of the Transatlantic Slave Trade. And through that experience be reminded of the atrocities committed and at the same time ensure that events like this would not occur again." (19)

CONTESTANTS

Some 310 nationals from 83 countries and five continents submitted their proposals. Sixteen made the initial cut. Dr. David Boxer, former curator of the National Gallery of Jamaica, and Chairman of the five-panel jury. (16)

DR. BOXER: (In English) M
"Up to that stage this was a blind
competition..//..we knew nothing about the
participants. // ..From that blind competition//

we were able to choose seven people and then we were informed who they were. And I tell you there were some surprises." (18)

Among the seven finalists, only one model would be chosen. (4)

"The big challenge for me was to find something that spoke to both things – the tragedy itself which requires a memorial in a more traditional sense, and something that is aspirational, something that looks towards the future that deals with the whole question of hope." (22)

A descendant of slaves shipped to Haiti from the coast of Africa, Rodney is an architect based in New York. Known for his work on the African Burial Ground National Monument in lower Manhattan, he explains his design. (13)

"What we decided to do was to establish a design that was reflective of a ship and at the same time a space that people can actually interact and kind of come into and learn more about the transatlantic slave passage." (15)

NARRATION:

Expected to be on display in New York in 2014, the Memorial will serve as a reminder to millions of visitors, teaching future generations to remember one of the most tragic events in history. (11)

The Ark of Return...a stark contrast to the Door of No Return..//..will stand as a call to action to ensure that this tragedy is never to be repeated. (10)
